Hall Update

Twelve months have passed very quickly since our last Newsletter. The Board has continued to work and improve the facilities at the Hall. Tree cropping to the back of the premises took place which also aided the Church relieving them of the cost but meant that there would be a ten-year period before the OMH building would be affected by the encroaching branches from the trees.

Further improvements and upgrades to the kitchen have taken place. A new dish washer to meet the updated codes of catering cleanliness has been installed. Further modifications to the gas supply and ovens have been implemented.

New LED light units have been in the toilet area continuing with the five-year plan to upgrade all the facilities, also reduce energy and our carbon footprint as is the countries general directive.

We have added an easy access storage area to our loft space. The area above the bar area could prove beneficial to the hall if we can store various archives in the area. Details of this will be sent out shortly.

During the July/August shutdown we carried out the decoration of the Dining Room, Toilets, Banner Room, Storage Areas and Office. Next year it is our plan to decorate the Bar and Entrance Hall area in accordance with our five year plan. A new non-slip easy clean floor was fitted in the kitchen area. The deep cleaning of the kitchen was completed prior to the installation of the flooring.

For safety reasons the stairs on the fire escape staircase were replaced, which should last for many years to come.

In the Temple the Master, Senior, and Junior Wardens podium tops were increased in size and refurbished.

The building committee under the Chairmanship of W.Bro. Roy Meleady, is constantly reviewing ideas for improvement of our facilities, and we would welcome your suggestions.

Break in at Orsett Masonic Hall

Several of you may have heard that there was a break in/burglary at the hall which is true. On the 12th July at approximately 11.30 p.m. the thieves gained access to the premises by ripping away the security bars on the ladies toilet window on the south side of the property. Smashed through the window and after crow barring the locked toilet door which gave them access to the bar area. The thieves smashed their way through the bar shutters then ripped out the till and smashing it on the floor, removed its contents.

Unfortunately, they also took our collection pots for the Royal British Legion, and Help for Heroes.

As a result of this we are now reviewing our security and will be making improvements to the premises. The only plus side was that nobody got hurt, but it has certainly opened our eyes for the future.

Per Capita Increase

All the Secretaries/Scribes/Recorders/Registrars have received a communication that the per capita cost is going to be increased to £10.00 per Brother per meeting. The current board has been very conscious of keeping costs to the Lodges as low as possible, and to this end we have trimmed costs and challenged prices to ensure that we have secured the best value for money agreements and works for OMH.

Unfortunately, we are now at a point that all the costs outside our control have increased and we have no option but to increase the per capita charge.

As you may be aware the minimum wage has risen by 26%, over the last four years, although OMH pays above the minimum wage the increase has had a considerable bearing on the wages cost.

With general maintenance charges increasing, together with small increases in utilities, although we have been able by long term contracts keep utilities costs to a minimum, all this has again added to the increase.

The increase small and amounts to 2.3% per year and keeps the per capita cost for our Hall at a very competitive cost.
